The form can be filled out electronically, but you must print it so you can sign it. Click on the link below to access the form 8843 online: https://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8843.pdf

All students and dependents considered non-residents for Federal Tax purposes must file the 8843 even if you did not earn any money in the U.S. Those who earned income and have to file a 1040NR or 1040NR-EZ should attach the 8843 with their tax return.

2	Write your country of citizenship during 2021. Not sure? What country does your passport page say?
