Title IX: The Basics

What is Title IX?

Title IX is a federal regulation that applies to all institutions that receive federal funding.

Title IX protects students, staff, and employees against sexual and genderbased discrimination and harassment. Lynn University prohibits sexual and gender-based misconduct on its campus or in any of its programs or activities.

What misconduct does Title IX cover?

Sexual Harassment.

Stalking.

Sexual Assault.

Domestic Violence.

Dating Violence.

Sexual Exploitation.

The Title IX Coordinator is responsible for determining if alleged misconduct falls under the purview of Title IX.

Even if it does not, you still have rights and resources and the Title IX Office is here to assist and support.
