International Programs and Services (IPS)

All students and dependents considered non-residents for Federal Tax purposes must file the 8843 even if you did not earn any money in the U.S. Those who earned income and have to file a 1040NR or 1040NR-EZ should attach the 8843 with their tax return.

Because tax advice and preparation is so specialized, you need to seek guidance from a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) or tax preparation service if you need assistance. The IPS staff does not have this type of expertise, and therefore cannot assist you with advice or preparation of these tax forms.

Do I really need to file? YES!

ALL international students who were in the U.S. for any period of time during any calendar year must file a federal tax statement, called an income tax return. This is true whether or not you worked in the U.S., gained income in the U.S., or received a scholarship during the past calendar year. **If you did not have any U.S. source income**, **you will only file** Form 8843.

What is the deadline for filing taxes with the IRS?

The deadline for filing your tax paperwork with the IRS depends on whether or not you received any taxable income in the previous calendar year. You must file your taxes before the tax deadlines listed below:

- If you received taxable income in 2024: April 15, 2025
- If you did not receive taxable income in 2024: April 15, 2025 (filing form 8843 only)
