

What is Consent?

YES means YES.

Consent IS:

Informed and Reciprocal. Each party must demonstrate a clear and mutual understanding of what is happening.

Freely and Actively Given. Not obtained through use of force, threats, or taking advantage of another's intoxication.

Definite. It may be withdrawn at any time.

Limited. Consent to one form of contact does not mean consent to all forms.

Consent IS NOT:

Expected or Assumed. Being in a relationship does not mean consent has been given.

Silent. The absence of a response or a "no" does not mean consent has been given.

Automatic. Having sex on a previous occasion does not mean consent has been given for the next occasion.
