A Teaching Experience

The student employment process should be viewed as an educational process for all involved. Students who are interviewed for a position are gaining valuable life skills and experience in going through the job hunting experience. Managers and supervisors should embrace this role to seek to educate their student employees in the spheres of communication, punctuality, dress code and professionalism to name a few. While fictional hospitals on shows such as Greys Anatomy and ER describe themselves as “teaching hospitals”, we as an educational institution are preparing our students for employment and life post Lynn University. Questions Submitted

Q.1. Can International Students work on campus?

RP. An international student may potentially work on campus. However, they will need to ensure that they have a social security number. A student will need to bring a letter from the institution to the Social Security Administration. This letter is produced by Employee Services with assistance from Student Financial Services and International Student Services. Without a social security number, it will not be possible for a student to successfully complete the required federal paperwork to begin working or to complete the required background check. The obtaining of a social security card can take up to 4 weeks.

Q.2. How long does it take a student to go through the student employment hiring process?
