Community Service

Student Financial Services is launching a new community service initiative for the New Year. Federal Work Study Students will be invited to apply to be in a select pool of students, which will be invited to work on community service projects throughout the Spring Semester. Students that apply and are selected for the position will be sent periodic emails and announcements, advising of upcoming events. Working at these events will allow the student to earn \$15 per hour of work. Events that are currently being planned include beach clean ups and helping out at food banks. All work-study eligible students will be emailed about these opportunities. A student will need to have completed the FAFSA in order for Student Financial Services to determine if they are eligible for Federal Work Study. Only US citizens and eligible non-citizens are eligible to complete the FAFSA and thus potentially qualify for this community service program.

Evaluations

While there is no formal performance appraisal in place

for student employees, all supervisors are encouraged to conduct an informal appraisal with their student workers. As stated in the previous newsletter, the student employment process should be viewed as an educational experience for all involved. Student workers are not only gaining hands on work experience while working at Lynn, they are also gaining invaluable life experience that will stay with them once they graduate. Supervisors are encouraged to connect with their student employees and review areas such as work quality, reliability, attitude, dependability, initiative, cooperation, judgment and leadership.
